Mark Allison, Community Parole Supervisor, to discuss the Transition Inmate Referral packets, the types of information included, and why it is important in the decision-making process.

- 1. Rose Roy, Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:15 pm. The Board meeting was held with Board members attending either virtually or in person.
 - a. <u>Study Session</u>: Rose Roy, Judge Chad Miller, Lori Griffith, Sean Foster, Mark Wester, and Mark Allison presented information to the board about how board decision-making affects each of their organizations (Public Defender, 4th Judicial District and County Courts, Probation, Facilities, Department of Corrections and Parole). Board members were advised to look at the Plea Agreements and the Summary of Supervision and answer the question, "Can this person be safely supervised in the community," a denial is a loss of a sentencing option, usually leaving only release to the community under probation or a Department Of Corrections (DOC) sentence; and that in the facilities there is a level of care with legal accountability and treatment. Brent Nelson called for a future discussion on how to mitigate revictimization, and Mark Allison stated he would follow up.
- 2. Attendance: The Board Vice-Chair called roll. Judith McCollum requested an excused absence for December 20th.

3. Case Review:

- **a. VRA Statements:** Registered victims in proposed client cases (Lambert and Zimmerle) addressed the board.
- b. Discussion and Balloting: Balloting was opened.
- 4. Approval of the Minutes: Lori Griffith moved, and Mike Pitt seconded to approve the meeting minutes for October 18, 2022, and the electronic meeting minutes for October 5th, 12th, and 26th, 2022. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

Kirsten Swenson left the meeting at 1:05 pm.

5. Program Reports:

- a. <u>ComCor, Inc. (CCI)</u>: Mark Wester reported for CCI. He stated that for the month of October, they had 263 residents, of which there were 96 Diversion, 88 Transition, 10 Condition of Parole, three Condition of Probation, 29 in Intensive Residential Treatment, four in Residential Dual Diagnosis Treatment, and 13 in CRP. CCI had 30 successful (73.2%) and 12 negative (26.8%) terminations; they had 7 escapes (17.1%) and 4 house/technical violations (9.8%). Mr. Wester reported that residents paid \$4,551.88 in Child Support payments and \$6,471.50 in restitution costs. He shared that they had a 71.0% employment rate, a 4.1% UA positive rate, and that they had 47 diversion client referrals, and 45 transition client referrals. Mr. Wester stated that CCI experienced an exclient showing up at the facility suffering an overdose. Staff witnessed this and performed life-saving measures; the ex-client did live. Mr. Wester recognized the professionalism of the CCI staff.
- b. <u>Community Alternatives of El Paso (CAE)</u>: Sean Foster reported for CAE. He stated that for the month of October 2022, CAE had 157 clients; of which 58 were Diversion and 98 were Transition; that they had 45 clients on non-residential status; that they had 10 Diversion, 18 Transition admissions, and six moved to Non-Residential status; that they had 13 successful (48.1%) terminations and 14 negative (51.9%) terminations; that they had 9 escapes that were up from last month; that have two security staff vacancies and one administrative staff vacancy; that they had a 79.1% employment rate and an 8% UA positive rate; and that they had 37 diversion client referrals and 35 transition client referrals. CAE has increased its testing for Spice (K2). Mr. Foster stated there were three medical emergency incidents. There was one residential death on October 1; staff did life safety measures. The case is under investigation. Mr. Foster stated that in October, all Case Managers, Case Management Supervisor, and Assistant Director Programs attended SOMB 101 training. Additional cameras were installed inside and outside the facility to assist with potential PREA or Security issues.

6. Monthly Reports:

- a. <u>SFY23 Financial Report</u>: Christine Burns reported that the current expected expenditure for SFY23 should be at 33.33%; that CAE was at 25% expended, representing 8.07% underspent; and that ComCor Inc. was at 37% representing 3.97% overspent.
- b. <u>Provider Termination Report</u>: Christine Burns reported that for the month of October 2022, ComCor, Inc. had a 73.17 Positive Termination/Successful termination rate, a 17.07% unauthorized absence rate, and a 9.76 technical violation termination rate. She reported that Community Alternative of El Paso County had a 33% unauthorized absence rate, house technical violations at a 19% rate, and a successful program completion rate of 48%.
- c. <u>Staff Report</u>: Christine Burns reported that the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ) released the Residential Community Corrections Referral Numbers for the first quarter of SFY23;

that DCJ has released its October 2022 Newsletter; that staff requested support from DCJ to provide PREA notification and investigation training; and that the search for a new Community Corrections Program Manager continues.

7. Old Business: None

Judge Rotolo left the meeting at 1:24 pm.

8. New Business:

- a. <u>Community Corrections Allocation Update</u>: Pete Carey stated that the County is looking to form a Community Corrections Authority, which would include an intergovernmental agreement with Teller County; that the authority would be responsible for contracts and Allocations; that this concept has been approved by the Division of Criminal Justice and the BOCC; that the next step is Teller County Board of County Commissioner approval.
- b. <u>ComCor, Inc. KPI Program</u>: Mark Wester presented the Key Performance Indicators (KPI) required by the Division of Criminal Justice, Office of Community Corrections. ComCor, Inc's key performance indicators will include staff retention and staff training metrics. KPI data collection will begin December 1, 2022, and through November 30, 2023, and will be results driven to determine performance-based contracting allocations.

Rose Roy moved, and Judith McCollum seconded to approve the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ), ComCor, Inc's KPI Program. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

c. <u>CAE - KPI Program</u>: Sean Foster presented the Key Performance Indicators (KPI) required by the Division of Criminal Justice, Office of Community Corrections. CAE's key performance indicators will include staff retention and staff training metrics. KPI data collection will begin December 1, 2022, and through November 30, 2023, and will be results driven to determine performance-based contracting allocations.

Lori Griffith moved, and Rose Roy seconded to approve the Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ), CAE's KPI Program. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.




