- 1. Rose Roy, Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:16 p.m. The Board meeting was held with Board members attending either virtually or in person.
  - a. <u>Study Session</u>: Corrections Training Support conducted a training session on BSMART.
- 2. Attendance: The Board Chair called roll. Judge Ann Rotolo and Lt. Paul Martinez requested excused absences for August 16, 2022.

### 3. Case Review

- **a. VRA Statements:** Registered victims in proposed client cases (Thomas Staub, Magdiel Marquez, and David Armendariz) addressed the board.
- b. Discussion and Balloting: Balloting was opened.
- 4. Approval of the Minutes: Jim Reid moved, and Mike Pitt seconded to approve the meeting minutes for June 21, 2022, and the electronic meeting minutes for June 1, 8, 15 and 29, 2022. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

### 5. Program Reports:

**a.** <u>ComCor, Inc. (CCI)</u>: Mark Wester reported for CCI. Mr. Wester stated CCI has a 254 bed allocation with 352 bed capacity; that they had a 263 average census; that they billed for \$131,217 in subsistence and collected \$104,000; now that the subsistence has been eliminated; that they had 74 admissions and 55 terminations; that the employment rate was at 76%; that the positive UA rate increased; that they had 10 client grievances mostly about accountability and rules violations; and that they had 56 diversion referrals and 62 transition referrals. Mr. Wester stated that 100% of staff have or will receive mental health first aid training; that renovations at the 3950 building have been placed on hold; and that they are investigating core security testing software for tracking purposes. Mr. Wester thanked staff for their support as the County works through the funding challenges due to

the subsistence changes and increased allocation to the County. In response to Board questions, Mr. Wester stated that the core security testing software was smart phone based using GPS technology and that their phone allowance policy was recently modified. In response to a question from Jim Reid, Christine Burns stated that the funding challenges were TABOR related.

b. <u>Community Alternatives of El Paso (CAE)</u>: Sean Foster reported for CAE. Mr. Foster stated CAE has a 237-bed allocation with an average capacity of 173 clients; that CAE had 68 diversion and 105 transition residents; that they had 16 successful and 14 negative terminations; that they collected \$98,570.00 in subsistence and \$4,449.87 in restitution; and that they had 0 escapes. Mr. Foster shared that the client employment rate was 82.2%; that they had an 8% positive UA rate; that there was one grievance; that they have some turnover in the case management and security staff; and that they have hired more security staff and maintaining the resident-to-case manager ratios. Mr. Foster stated that they continue and have added contraband searches with one arrested resulting. He stated that Covid precautions are being practiced. He shared that they have provided staff with a salary increase and are using sign-on and referral bonuses.

# Lt. Paul Martinez left the meeting at 1:01pm.

# 6. Monthly Reports:

- a. <u>SFY22 Financial Report</u>: Christine Burns reported that for SFY22 ending on June 30, 2022, CCI was overspent by .71% and CAE underspend by 24.15%. She stated that the SFY22 contract was for \$10,293,026.42; that the State has made payment of 86.67% of contract; that the County has paid \$88.52% of contract; and that the State will provide a final payment expected at \$187,194.79.
- b. <u>Provider Termination Report</u>: Christine Burns reported that for the month of June 2022, ComCor, Inc. had a 49.1% successful program completion rate, a 20% escape rate, a 30.9% house technical violation rate. She reported that Community Alternative of El Paso County also had a 36.7% escape rate, house technical violations at 16.7% rate, and a successful program completion rate of 46.7%.
- c. <u>Staff Report</u>: Christine Burns reported that the Board of County Commissioner Liaison is currently reviewing citizen applications for current board vacancies; that the notification reporting matrix and the PREA incidents communication procedures were presented; that the Video Victim Impact Statement technology has been purchased; that County leadership is currently discussing and negotiating contract and allocation process; that the Colorado Association of Community Corrections Boards will host a meeting on October 14<sup>th</sup> and invited Board attendance; and that Adult Parole will begin to file charged on individuals with unauthorized absence from community corrections supervision

# 7. Old Business:

a. <u>By-Laws Revision – 3rd Reading:</u> A third reading of the proposed Community Corrections Board By-Laws was held.

# Mike Pitt moved, and Jim Reid seconded to endorse the By-Laws Amendment as presented for BoCC Action. The motion passed 8-0-1 by roll call vote.

# 8. New Business:

- a. <u>Video Impact Statement Training:</u> Tiffany Weaver presented a training on how to review the video impact statements that the community corrections program will now offer. In response to questions from the Board, Mrs. Weaver stated that the opportunity is in addition to current options (written and in-person statements) and is an option now available to all registered victims on a referred case. Jim Reid asked if there are options for those that speak a language other than English, and Christine Burns stated staff will investigate further on how to implement a process.
- 9. Case Review Ballot Results: Results of the ballot were read.
- 10. Board/Staff Comments: NA
- 11. Adjournment: Chair Rose Roy adjourned the meeting at 1:33 p.m.



Fidelity Specialist and Case Manager Supervisor to measure staff progress via observation and auditing of case plans.	In July, the Case Management Supervisor reviewed twenty-nine files. Several files had repeats from previous reviews. Those Case Managers were addressed through performance management. Two more Case Managers were hired in June. They have been shadowing other Case Managers and will have SOA-R training in August. All of the Case Managers are working together to ensure their case plans for the residents are meaningful and have buy-in from the residents. Ten case files were reviewed and any issue were addressed. Monitoring continues for the newer case managers' files. The Case Management Supervisor is still finding the similar concerns as in the past. The Case Management Supervisor is spending more time with a newwer case manager to ensure he is grasping his job duties. She continues to conduct spot audits on case files and meets individually with each case manager if she observes the same issues being repeated. CAE had three new Case Managers start in March. We took the opportunity for then to observe other Case Managers and see the importance of building repore and using the tools they are given with the residents. SOA-R and Progression Matrix has been scheduled for them. The Case Management Supervisor had the opportunity to review the newest Case Manager files. Notes for corrections have been given, and a follow-up in March is scheduled. Case Managers are sharing their case plans with other co-workers to review and recieve feedback. These were completed and notes were given to the case managers for corrections. Weekly meetings are being conducted with case management staff with case plan coaching as a reoccuring topic. Case Management training was conducted on a monthly employment chrons and the importance of proper and timely entry. Two new Case Managers completed SOA-R and Progression Matrix training.

Staff were engaged in conversations that were both empowering and meaningful.

Search and Contraband Training for staff: Scheduled and Completed Training *CS-30 Contraband	Additional rounds are being made throughout the facility. Staff are communicating with each other when they are conducting bunk searches on items they are finding. This allows staff to be more aware when they are conducting the next search or searching a resident's proerty when they come into the facility. Additional search and contraband training has been conducted. The most recent contraband item list was disseminated to staff to ensure they are aware of the items. Staff were designated to conduct most of the bunk searches. Contraband has been found, some drug paraphernalia and a small amount of drugs. One female resident was arrested by CSPD. We have been able to designate several security staff to focus on locker searches and facility searches. Senior Security staff are taking the newer staff with them when conducting room/bunk searches, to show them what to look for, and how to leave items. Security staff had found many of items for the month of February. Search and contraband training was scheduled for 12/20/21, 01/03/22 and 01/06/22. Policies and procedures are in place; the focus for training and evaluation will be on the process and documenting appropriately.
*CS Substance Use Monitoring Drug Interdiction Events and Outcomes: Security Manager and Fidelity Specialist observations, audits, findings and actions taken.	On July 29th, a K9 searched facility common areas and the female resident rooms. The K9 alerted on two female resident rooms which were searched. Only nuisance contrand was found. All of the females in those rooms were also drug tested. During bunk searches and common area searches, some drug paraphernalia was founded. Residents are required to submit to drug testing if the drug paraphernalia was found in their property. In May, CAE had a K9 search in the facility No drugs were found, UA's were increased or bunks that were hit on. The Fidelity Specialist conducted spot checks on 20 files. Of those 20 files, three were corrected and staff were provided additional direction. We continue to have discussion with residents to ensure that they are getting something out of their treatment. We are ensuring that resident's treatment is increase upon their first positive UA. We have discussions with them as to what is occurring in their lives and what is needed to stop drug use. We spoke with our UA provider to get fentanyl on our UA panel. Three residents tested positive for fentanyl once this change was made. An audit was conducted of the UA's, and numbers need to be adjusted for many of the new residents that came into the program. On January 14, 2022, a K9 Search was conducted because of three recent overdoses in Serenity and Tranquilty bays. The K9 only searched those areas from where the overdoses had occurred. On January 25, 2022, the SM and FS conducted a spot audit and actively observed 20 resident. Of the 20 files reveiwed, 2 were found incomplete with information and were corrected and staff were given additional direction. Observation of substance testing was accurate and based on individual LSI consistent with the standard.

Security Staff have a template that captures all of the information needed when conducting whereabouts. A location app has been researched and the facility is in process of obtaining approval and implementation. They have also been instructed to notify the shift supervisor immediately if a resident is off location. Training is ongoing, and security staff have a designated area for completing work whereabouts utilizing facility phones. Case Management staff are using team approach to complete random off-site visits for verifcation.



# Analysis of the Data

- A Resident called GEO PREA hotline, stated the Security Staff member had went into Tranquility bathroom after 2 other staff had conducted house count. The staff member looked at the resident didn't say anything and walked out. Then several minutes later, came back to the bathroom, after resident was in the shower, and stared at resident through the clear top of the shower curtain, as resident is naked. This allegation was unfounded as staff are required to verify a living breathing person during their facility rounds and no camera views were available.
- Several female residents have made allegations that Security Staff Member has shown them or sent to them inappropriate
  pictures or videos of his genitalia. Other allegations include requests for nude pictures of the female residents and asking them
  to meet with him after they get off work. One resident stated that he pulled her into him. Local Law enforcement was contacted
  and they contacted the female resident. Facility Director was notified by law enforcement that she did not want to make a
  statement. This allegation has not been finalized as it is currently under investigation by Law Enforcement Officers.
- A male resident had stated another male resident in the same living area was masturbating and it was causing issues and concerns for him.




