1. **Pat Kelly, Chair, called the meeting to order at 12:16 p.m.** The Board meeting was held with Board members attending virtually.

Reminder for next month (February) will be selecting a Chair and Vice-Chair; if interested contact El Paso County, Angel Medina. Patty Kelly will be departing in April 2022.

- a. <u>Study Session</u>: Sex Offender Management Board (SOMB) Angelina Weant from the 4<sup>th</sup> Judicial Probation Office discussed the standards and guidelines for the assessment, evaluation, treatment, and behavioral monitoring of adult sex offenders who have committed sex offenses. The objective of the Sex Offender Management Board (SOMB) is to treat and manage sex offenders so that they can be successful in reducing the risk of recidivism. SOMB standards are designed to establish a basis for systematic management and treatment of sex offenders. The legislative mandate to the SOMB and the primary goals of the standards are the safety of the community and the protection of victims. The standards are not punitive, but preventative and palliative. The outline research-based best practices that are most likely to result in successfully rehabilitating the offender and preventing additional crimes.
- **2. Attendance:** The Board Chair called roll. Future excused absences were requested by Martha McKinney for tentative on February 2022 meetings. Re-appointing Jim Reid to the Community Correction Board.
- 3. Case Review VRA Statements: Registered victims in proposed client cases (Regina Davies, Carlos Sisneros, Jason Smith, Christopher Correll and Vernon Jago) addressed the board.
- 4. Case Review: Discussion and Balloting: Chair Pat Kelly called for case discussion with no cases called.
- 5. Approval of the Minutes: Jim Reid moved to approve the meeting minutes for December 21, 2021, and the electronic meeting minutes for December 1, 8, 15, and 29, 2021. Martha McKinney seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

#### 6. Program Reports:

- a. ComCor, Inc. (CCI): Mark Wester reported for CCI. Mr. Wester stated for December 2021 demographics for CCI is 352 beds; DCJ allocation is 254; there are 146 diversion; 64 transition; 17 out-of-district and 22 IRT specialized program, 11 RDDT, 16 CRP, 11 Non-CRP (sex offenders that go out into the community for therapy); criteria cases 140 (the ones you voted on). Collected \$123,770.60 in subsistence in the month of December; for child support CCI is gathering the data and will provide at the next board meeting and for restitution CCI collected \$18,051.35. Mr. Wester stated that CCI had in the month of December for admissions was 68 which includes 24 diversion, nine transition, five COP, eight COPr, 11 non-residential. Terminations for December were a total of 68 which includes about 46% successful completion, nineteen clients that changed status which means the client for example transferred to IRT or was a reject after accept (RAA), about 32% negative termination; 14 escapes; 10 technical violations; and three committed new crimes. Mr. Wester stated that facility staffing is strong. They are hiring front line staff; which there are 5 open positions and hired one admin staff, a new Quality Assurance Coordinator, Jenner Behan. Mr. Wester discussed an incident that occurred in December, regarding a transition client over dosing, which caused the client's death. The client was located in the bathroom during headcount. CCI did contact Colorado Springs Police Department (CSPD) at the time; CCI is conducting an internal review and would provide detail at a later time. Mr. Wester stated the employee rate is 75%, which is down and believes it is related to increased COVID outbreaks; the regression rate is 11.5%; positive UAs rate is 19.5%. CCI will be increasing using the K9 Units for random searches because there has been a spike in positive UAs. CCI is looking into new additional technology that will help reduce positive UAs for example the new vendor tests for fentanyl and 20 additional substances. In December CCI reviewed 122 diversion referrals and 52 auto/criteria referrals, Mr. Wester discussed the Pace Audit regarding Building 3950 renovation – The architect is developing drawings to inform and plan systems and major facility upgrades and pursing funding sources to offset the \$400k investment. CCI is selling one of the vacant/non-used properties to allocate 200K to put back to building 3950. He discussed the Core Audit, in which he states that all security staff have been provided "go bags" as part of their uniform, which contains gloves, Narcan and walkietalkies to ensure that all staff are able to immediately respond to emergencies. Training has been completed on how to use Narcan in the course of providing CPR.
- b. Community Alternatives of El Paso County (CAE): Dustin Long reported for CAE, filling in for Gwen Barlow that is on COVID leave. In December, Mr. Long stated there are 173 clients total; that breaks down to 75 diversion; 98 transition; five out-of-district; eight Non-CRP (sex offenders that go out into the community for therapy); 43 non-residential clients; and criteria cases 80 (the ones you voted on). Collected \$171,594.38 in subsistence; for restitution CCI collected \$5,604.87. Total 17 successful terminations and there were seven escapes and three house violations. Mr. Dustin Long discussed the PACE Audit for December; the Fidelity Specialist and Case Manager Supervisor completed 17 audits on case plans. They were completed and notes were given to the case managers for corrections. Weekly meetings are being conducted with case management staff with case plan coaching as a reoccurring topic. He discussed the CORE Audit, which CAE continued training with Security staff about the importance of proper searches of all areas of the facility to include ingress and egress points for possible placement of contraband. The staff members have been shown photos and given referral information regarding what signs and symptoms to be aware of when working with the residents.

#### 7. Monthly Reports:

- a. <u>SFY22 Financial Report</u>: Angel Medina reported the current expected expenditure for SFY22; CAE is at 36.4%, representing 13.36% underspent, and that ComCor, Inc. is at 48.51%, representing 1.49% underspent.
- b. <u>Unauthorized Absence Report</u>: Angel Medina reported that for the end of December 2021, the unauthorized absence rate for Diversion clients was 37.8% and 24.6% for Transition clients. He stated that CCI had 14 escapes and CAE had 7 escapes. He reported the successful completion rate for Diversion clients was 31.3% and 48.6% for Transitional clients.

#### c. Staff Report:

- 1. Angel Medina shared the Take TWO (Transitional Work Opportunity) Program: The Colorado Department of Corrections (DOC) Take TWO (Transitional Work Opportunity) Program is a reentry program designed around normality and progression for offenders to have an opportunity to work for an outside employer and earn a prevailing or marketable wage to prepare offenders for reentry into society. The offenders may live at the facility, Transitional Work Center, or non-prison environment during the transitional work period. The program provides offenders an opportunity to acquire some monetary savings prior to their release from prison, improves their job skills to make them more marketable and employable, increases their personal responsibility, and reestablishes a social network within a community. The offenders are eligible for Take TWO programming before they are eligible for Community Corrections. The offenders in the program who leave to Community Corrections are considered Take TWO graduates. The criteria for the Take TWO Program are:
  - 1) Less than 36 months to Mandatory Release Date or Sentence Discharge Date and/or less than 24 months from parole eligibility date.
  - 2) Low Risk to Moderate Risk on CTAP assessment.
  - 3) Meets external grounds clearance criteria.
  - 4) Victim Services review: notification will be made to the registered victim.
  - 5) Preference to offenders who have completed their GED or high school diploma.
  - 6) Positive progression and have a record of good behavior.
  - 7) Electronic monitoring may be utilized to track offenders while outside facilities for security, accountability, and safety precautions.
- 2. Colorado Community Corrections Standards Review Survey: The Office of Community Corrections (OCC), are asking community correction stakeholders to take some time over the next few months to provide feedback and suggestions for consideration in the review process. Each survey installment would be open for comments for 2 weeks. The first survey would be distributed the week of January 3rd, 2022, and every three weeks thereafter (January 24th, February 14th, and March 7th). In each survey installment, you would be asked if you'd like to be considered to participate in a working group to review feedback for that section. The first working group would begin February, with one working group per month thereafter, in March, April, and May. Each working group would be comprised of a variety of stakeholder group representation and the members would vary per working group. The final Standards recommendations would be presented to the Governor's Advisory Council on June 2022 meeting.

- 8. Old Business: N/A
- 9. New Business: 2022 Sunshine Act Memorandum: Angel Medina discussed endorsing the 2022 Sunshine Act Memorandum. The Justice Service Department shall be responsible for ensuring appropriate notice of Community Corrections Board meetings. The notice would be given in the form of an agenda which will state the time, date, and location of the meeting and a brief description of the agenda items for the respective meeting as required by the Sunshine Act. The agendas would be posted on the County's website.

Jim Reid moves to endorse the 2022 Sunshine Act Memorandum and Billie Ratliff seconds.

- **10.** Case Review Ballot Results: Results of the ballot were read.
- 11. Board/Staff Comments: NA.
- 12. Executive Session: Staff requested Executive Session to discuss a sensitive matter related to an ongoing investigation. Though the Board voted to go into Executive Session, there was no discussion as it was determined that an Executive Session must be canceled due to legal advisement from the County Attorney.

#### **CCC-020: Incident Notification**

The types of incidents regarding clients and/or staff members that require written notification to referral and oversight agencies shall include, but are not limited to:

- (a) The occurrence of any communicable disease that poses a significant threat to staff or clients.
- (b) Any criminal offense alleged to have been committed by a client or staff member on or off grounds.
- (c) Any altercation, on or off grounds, involving a client resulting in injury or law enforcement involvement.
- (d) The death of a client.

- (e) Use of force by a staff member.
- (f) Any event that has compromised or may compromise the provision of supervision and safe care, including but not limited to damage to the facility, employee strike, interruption in food service, and/or protracted interruption in utilities.
- (g) Any event that has the potential for media coverage.
- (h) Any occurrence within the facility in which a client, visitor or staff is removed by ambulance, treated in an emergency department, or admitted to a hospital and the individual sustained serious bodily injury, or there is a significant risk to loss of life.

The program shall notify the local community corrections board, referral agencies and the DCJ immediately by phone and by follow-up email within 24 hours of the incident. Notification must clarify the status of the incident and any action(s) being taken to resolve the situation.

3. In the 2021 legislative session, the Colorado legislature made a formal Request for Information (RFI) for the Department to provide an update on PBC: "As part of its FY 2022-23 budget request, the Department is requested to submit a proposal for the implementation of performance-based contracting. This proposal should include payment models, outcomes to evaluate the performance of community providers and local community corrections boards, baseline targets for the Program Assessment for Correctional Excellence (PACE) and core security audits, the frequency of PACE and core security audits, and a warning system for underperforming providers. The Department is requested to submit this proposal no later than January 3, 2022."

The Department contracted with Government Performance Solutions, Inc., in April 2021 to help develop and facilitate a transparent and inclusive stakeholder engagement process to inform OCC's response to the RFI. Stakeholder input is critical to developing and implementing a successful model for PBC in community corrections. Stakeholder views are acknowledged throughout the RFI response.

In order to keep you informed of the proposed plan as submitted to the legislature, we are sharing with you below the full OCC response to the RFI.

#### RFI Highlights

Key aspects of the department's plan as submitted to the legislature include:

#### **Performance Metrics and Targets**

The performance metrics and targets included in the proposed plan represent items both in the direct and indirect control of system providers, with a focus on program quality, program compliance, and individual client outcomes.

- Risk-Informed Outcomes
  - o Metrics: Successful Completion and Recidivism
  - Targets: Will be based on data analysis and formulas to set appropriate targets based on multiple years' worth of Colorado system performance.
- Program Compliance

- o Metrics: Core Security Audit
- o Target: Composite score of 2 or higher
- Program Quality
  - o Metrics: PACE Evaluation
  - o Target: Composite score one deviation above the mean of statewide baseline measurement
- Key Performance Indicators
  - Metrics: Staff training and retention indicators
  - Target: Specific metrics and targets to be individualized with input from local community corrections board in consideration of local needs, barriers, etc.

#### **Payment Model**

The payment model proposed includes several key factors:

- Slow progression into increased incentives and decrease of base per diem to allow for the system to become accustomed to the new contracting and reimbursement method.
- A model that allows for future flexibility in metrics, weights, and payments that can evolve with the system over time.
- Solutions to address concerns about funding and initial investment to ensure the success of PBC.
- Increased accountability and financial impacts for poor performance.

#### **Timeline**

The timeline submitted aims to get the first incentive payments out as soon as Fiscal Year 2022-23 for risk-informed; outcomes while proposing a slower timeline for other metric areas in regard to a reasonable audit and evaluation cycle. The audit and evaluation cycle takes into account resources needed and adequate time between audits and evaluations for improvements and corrections to be made.
